Other Degree Requirements

The BAS in Human Services is a 124-hour degree. Besides the major, the following are required:*

■ Professional Development:

This section includes 12 semester hours in social science electives and 12 hours in general elective credit. If choosing the Early Childhood Development specialization, the following are required to fulfill the Professional Development requirements:

- Twelve hours from the following:
 - Literature Based Approaches to Teaching Reading (EDLI 3307)
 - Teaching English as a Second Language (EDLI/ENGL 4345)
 - Partnering with Parents (ECHD 4312)
 - Math and Science for Young Children (ECHD 4301)
 - Administration of Programs for Young Children (ECHD 4319)

■ **Experiential Professional Development:** Up to 12 semester hours can be earned from work experience with military performance evaluations, job performance appraisals or a supervisor's evaluation on a WBU form.

■ **General Electives:** Nine semester hours required.
