Tuition

Undergraduate:

Classroom: \$192/hr. Virtual Campus: \$276/hr.

Graduate:

Classroom: \$229/hr. Virtual Campus: \$312/hr.

Technology Fee: \$9/hr. (applies to all classes)

Prior balances must be paid in full before registration is permitted. One-third of total tuition is due at the time of registration; second third is due in 30 days, with the balance due within 60 days, or a \$50 late fee will be incurred for each late payment. Exceptions will be made only for those students who have third-party billing. Those receiving financial aid must have their 2009/2010 award letter prior to the time of registration.

Drop Policy - Drop Fee: \$10/class

Before 1st class meets: 100% tuition refund

Before 2nd class: 75% refund

Before 3rd class: 25% refund

After the 3rd class meets: no refund

New Students:

All transcripts from other schools must be received prior to registering for a second term, and before an official WBU transcript can be released.
