

Testing for Active Military:

We are proud to be the official CLEP/DSST testing center for Elmendorf AFB, and are pleased to offer these testing services to other military personnel. All active-duty military personnel can take DSST and CLEP exams at Wayland Baptist University, Parkside Site—even those who are not WBU students. Active Duty, Reserves, and National Guard military service members have no examination fees, and no sitting fees.

Testing Days and Times:

By reservation only, made at least 24 hours in advance

Tuesdays - Wednesdays - Thursdays

10:30am - 1pm - 2:30pm

All tests are computerized except for a few essays.

Requirements: Military personnel must present a military ID and a second form of government-issued photo ID (such as a driver's license or passport) on the day of the test.

Testing Fees for Civilians: WBU students and other civilians (including military spouses and dependents)

CLEP and DSST tests are free for active members of the US Armed Services.

All others pay fees that must be paid separately as listed, they may not be combined.

Sitting Fee: \$20 – Check, money order or cash only
(made out to Wayland Baptist University)

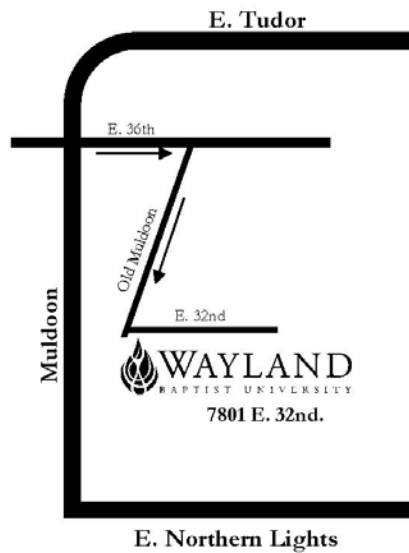
CLEP: \$72 – Check, money order, or credit card. Please no cash.
(To “College Level Examination Program”)

CLEP essay: \$10 - Paid by Check, money order, or credit card. Please no cash.
(To “College Level Examination Program”)

DSST: \$80 - Credit card only.
Paid online to DSST at the time the test begins.

Identification Required on Test Days: Testers on the test day must produce two forms of identification: the primary must be a government-issued photo ID with signature and all military must present their military ID card, and the secondary must be an ID having either a photo or signature, such as a social security card, military ID, student ID, credit card, etc.

Location: The Wayland Baptist University Test Center is located at 7801 E. 32nd Ave.; Anchorage, AK; 99504. Physically, the Test Center is on the access road (named Old Muldoon Highway) just west of Muldoon Road. Do Not Bring:

Testers may not bring food, beverages, books, papers, or any electronic devices (including PDA's and cell phones) into the testing room. Be prepared to leave these items, as well as all personal articles (coat, purse, etc) in a cubby in the testing office. Scratch paper, pencils will be issued by the testing center as authorized for each test

The Test Itself:

Each test takes approximately 90 minutes – 2hrs. All exams are administered electronically on test center computers, and scores are available to testers immediately upon completion.
