

Bachelor of Science Occupational Education

The BSOE is an inverted degree program which allows individuals to apply a vocational/technical field as credit toward an applied associate's degree and, in turn, to apply the associate's degree toward a BSOE degree. Students in this degree program desire to enhance their knowledge, analytical abilities and critical thinking skills for upward mobility in their field. The student may select from seven majors (Business Administration, Human Services, Justice Administration, Religion, Occupational Education, Management, Career & Technical Education) which combine non-traditional credit with a traditional liberal arts background.

The major in Human Services exposes students to coursework in sociology, psychology and ethics. This coursework is designed to prepare individuals for careers in social service fields, social work and related industries.

Professional Development:

The professional development component consists of 24 semester hours selected to provide depth or breadth to the major and to provide substantive developmental knowledge for the student's career or personal goals.

Experiential Professional Development:

Credit may be given for up to 12 upper level hours for full-time supervised work experience. Civilians may submit employer evaluations and military members may submit EPRS, FITREPS and evaluations.

General Electives:

Nine semester hours required.

Transfer Credit Hours:

Hours may come from traditional, regionally accredited junior or senior college. Students may be eligible to transfer more than 1/3 of degree requirements from the following: Military Occupational Specialty, Military Service Schools and CCAF, as well as testing such as CLEP, DANTES and Excelsior or prior learning assessment.

Associate of Applied Science

Course Requirements (63 hours): Students majoring in Human Services must complete 33 semester hours of core courses as well as 30 hours in general education. A minimum of 15 hours must be taken at Wayland.
